## From the Rector's Desk

Dear People of God:

We have an opportunity coming up the end of this month that we have never had before. To say I am excited about it would be an understatement. It is unlike anything we have offered before in the area of Christian formation. It touches everything that we do as a community of faith. It is a Eucharistic workshop, conducted by Mr. Bill Ryon, who developed the workshop and has taught it in many parishes throughout the United States, and who is a parishioner at St. Paul's Church, K Street, in Washington, D.C.

The workshop consists of three sessions. The first will be on Friday, 28 January, with two optional times, one in the morning after the 10:00 AM mass, and one in the evening beginning at 5:30. Sessions II and III are on Saturday morning, beginning with a continental breakfast at 8 o'clock.

The workshop will deal with the scriptural foundation of the mass, Early Church (Patristic) understandings, later developments in the Medieval Church, and Ref-

ormation understandings. Why we do what we do today in the Holy Eucharist will be explained in an understandable and enjoyable way.



It is my hope that as many of our parishioners as possible will attend. There will be a small charge of \$5.00 per participant to help cover our expenses, but scholarships are available (just speak with me if you need a scholarship). So that we can have an idea of how many to expect, we would like for you to make a reservation, paying the fee in advance, at the sign-up table in Gillespie Hall beginning on 2 January or in the parish office.

The heart of Christian Worship is the Holy Eucharist, and it is certainly at the heart of everything we do at the Church of the Redeemer. To understand more fully this act of Christian worship will enhance our common life immeasurably. Please

make this opportunity a part of your planning for this month. You will be glad you did.

## Stewardship at Redeemer

This is another article in a series describing the stewardship practiced by Redeemer ministries in helping others, while carefully preserving and enhancing the assets of the church.

The Church of the Redeemer Endowment Fund was established three years ago by the Vestry to provide a means for parishioners to give to the church in a way to insure "the future growth and preservation of the church...beyond what is possible through its annual operating fund." At that time, the church initialized the fund by transferring capital into it.

The Fund is managed by the Endowment Committee. The goal of the committee is to grow the fund but in a conservative way so that the assets are preserved as much as possible. The Fund is to be used, when needed, for major future projects. It is not to be used to support current operations unless there is a critical need and such use requires approval of the Vestry. The Fund provides a stewardship vehicle for those wishing to invest their contributions for long term use of the parish.

The Committee consists of the Rector and four member appointed by the Rector and approved by the Vestry. The Rector serves as President of the committee and the current four other members are Betsy Engels, John Lineweaver, Ron Rayevich, and Joe Smith. Most of the members have extensive experience managing investment portfolios. In addition, the Senior Warden, Church Treasurer, Chairman of the Finance Committee, Business Manager, and Jason Hughes, who is responsible for Planned Giving, attend each meeting.

The Endowment Fund Committee meets at least quarterly to review the results of the fund's investment manager, currently State Street Global Advisors, the invest-

ment management arm of State Street Bank. Providing additional assistance is the Church Pension Fund, which works with the investment manager and offers advice on allocation of the funds under management.

As of 30 September 2010, Redeemer's long term invested assets (endowment) consisted of \$3,010,000 allocated between restricted funds (dedicated to a specific purpose by the donor) and unrestricted funds. These funds are managed with the goal of providing a total return of the long term inflationary rate plus 5% per annum. The total return on the endowment for the twelve months ending 30 September 2010 was 9.41%. Due to difficult economic and financial conditions the prior two years, the fund generated a negative return for the three year period ending 30 September 2010, but for the last five years the total return has been a positive 2.36%.

At the end of September 2010, these funds were allocated between various securities as follows: 61.6% in corporate domestic and international common stocks, 30.7% in United States corporate and government bonds, 6.1% in REITs and commodities and 1.5% in cash equivalents.

There are various ways parishioners can contribute to the Fund. They may do so directly or through Planned Giving. To learn more about direct contributions, contact a member of the Committee or call the parish office at 955.4263.

Planned giving takes a number of forms, from bequests to various tax favored charitable trust mechanisms. The John Hamilton Gillespie Society was established by Redeemer to recognize those individuals and families who have remembered the church in their estate plans, but more so, to enable members and friends to witness to the value of Redeemer in their lives and to secure its ministries for gen-

erations to come. The society currently has about 56 members. Jason Hughes oversees the Planned Giving process and can be contacted any time at 364.7495.

The Endowment Fund Committee encourages stewardship through gifts and bequests to the fund, either restricted by the donor or unrestricted, and assures those making such gifts and bequests that their beneficent donations will be looked after with the care and thoughtfulness of the other long term assets of the Church and handled by professional investment managers and custodians with strong histories as responsible fiduciaries.

So, there are several avenues available for parishioners to practice stewardship by donating treasure to Redeemer. They may do so by pledging and giving to support current operations including our important ministries, youth programs and upkeep of the facilities or by giving to funds which will be invested for future needs.

## Youth News

Mission work is one of the most important aspects of the youth program at Redeemer. In an effort to keep mission constantly on our mind every month there will be at least one article from our young people that went to either Maricao, Puerto Rico, or to Birmingham, Alabama. I hope you all enjoy reading about our young peoples' adventures!

To our dismay, all of the construction work that we were scheduled to get done had already been completed by the church. Despite the letdown, I believe that the Lord worked it out like that so we would channel all of our focus and energy into the Vacation Bible School that we hosted for the church. All of the children in the neighborhood came and enjoyed the lessons, games, and worship. I could see the Lord working in these kids when I saw the way their faces would light up when we came to see them during the week. I know in my heart that just playing and talking with the children really had more of an impact in the community than painting a few houses ever would. The day we had to leave, I was so reluctant to have to say goodbye to all of the new friends I made while I was there and I pray that what we did really had a positive impact on their lives as much as they did on mine. I'll never forget a single one of those children and am so glad I had the chance to go to Puerto Rico and lend a helping hand to the town of Maricao.

The Church of the Redeemer is very pleased to bring Bill Ryon, a layman with degrees in theology and spiritual direction, to present this important and fascinating workshop on the Holy Eucharist – which promises to be, says Father Robinson, “unlike anything we have offered before in the area of Christian formation.” The two-day sessions promise to be an enriching, educational, and inspiring opportunity for all parishioners, young and old, to deepen their faith -- particularly in the area of understanding our central act of worship.

“There is a long distance between the thinking place and the heart, where real worship takes place,” says Ryon, who has been leading workshops on this subject for many years to diverse audiences including parishes, schools, and retirement communities across the country. “These presentations are designed to get people to *think* about what they do on Sunday mornings, e.g., ‘How is it that I worship the Lord this way?’, or ‘How might I more intimately enter into the presence of Christ here at the Parish Church with God's people and the presider whom I have agreed to lead me in worship?’”

The workshop will deal with the scriptural foundation of the mass, Early Church (Patristic) understandings, later developments in the Medieval Church, and Reformation understandings. The question of “Why do we do what we do today in the Holy Eucharist?” will be explained in a way that is understandable and enjoyable.

“The heart of Christian Worship is the Holy Eucharist, and it is certainly at the heart of everything we do at the Church of the Redeemer,” says Father Robinson. “To understand more fully this act of Christian worship will enhance our common life immeasurably, and it is my hope that as many of our parishioners as possible will attend.”

The Eucharist Workshop is divided into three **sequential** sessions and though Ryon suggests that attendance at all classes will help parishioners to receive the “full benefit” of the entire workshop, those who can only attend one or two of the sessions are still encouraged to attend when they can.

The first workshop session takes place at two times on Friday, 28 January: first at 10:45 AM, and then again at 5:30 PM. On Saturday, 29 January, the second session begins with a Continental Breakfast in Gillespie Hall, with the workshop beginning promptly at 8:30 AM. The workshop breaks at 10:00 AM for the Holy Eucharist, and then resumes with the third and final session beginning at 10:45 AM. All sessions last an hour and a half.

There is a small fee of \$5 to offset costs for this workshop; scholarships are available by request to the Rector's office. Advance registration and payment is requested so we may plan accordingly for space and Saturday breakfast needs. ## Take Your Place

Bill Henderson, a former Caritas volunteer, recently wrote Father Robinson relaying an incident that speaks to the growth that can occur when serving others. With his permission, an excerpt from that letter follows below.

“I will never forget an incident that occurred late one morning at the Caritas trailer. A young woman was there to ask for help with an overdue utility bill. She was an articulate woman, a teacher’s aide, whose husband had left her. She had her small son with her, a well-behaved boy, perhaps about five or six years old. I gave him paper and pencils to entertain himself while his mother was occupied. I played with him just a bit and entertained him with sleight of hand coin tricks. We kind of connected. When his mother’s turn came, she did not have the required documents to receive assistance. The office was minutes away from closing and she was crest-fallen, realizing that she would probably not get any assistance that day, after waiting all morning. I asked her if she lived very far from the trailer and, if not, she could go home, get the paperwork, and return while we waited. She did just that, and while she was in the trailer doing the transaction, I stepped outside on the porch with her son. He politely asked if he could sing me a song. In the little boy’s pure voice, he began to sing a song about Jesus and how much He loves us. It wasn’t familiar, perhaps a traditional Hispanic song, with several verses. There were a few other clients nearby who witnessed the moment and tears began to fall from each of us. I knelt down to the boy and he gave me a big hug which I gratefully returned. I thanked him for his song just as his mother came outside, her business finished.

That moment is etched in my mind forever. It was Caritas who gave me the opportunity to learn more about compassion and humility.”
