CHURCH of the REDEEMER SARASOTA, FLORIDA

Located in the heart of downtown Sarasota

Sunday School: Sunday School classes, essential as families and the parish partner to foster faith that sticks, take place throughout the academic year for all children and youth from 10:10 to 10:45 on Sunday mornings. Grades K-3 meet in the Bell Tower wing, and grades 4 -12 meet in the classrooms above Gillespie Hall. Classes are also offered during the 1PM Spanish Mass.

First Communion Class: This class exposes our Kindergartners and their parents to the mystery and ritual of the Holy Eucharist through a five-week Instructed Eucharist Class, during Sunday School time in Lent. The class receives their First Communion on Easter Day.

Baptism Instruction Class: The Sacrament of Holy Baptism is administered on the 1st Sunday after the Epiphany, Easter Vigil, Day of Pentecost, and All Saints' Day. Baptism Instruction Classes, required for parents and godparents, are conducted the four Sundays prior to each of these days, after the 9 AM Mass.

Children's Chapel: Held Sundays during the 9:00 AM Mass and led by our Youth Minister and clergy, children K-5th leave for Gillespie Hall after the reading of the Gospel, and return following the Peace. Included is a child reading the Gospel, age-appropriate homily, Creed, Prayers of the People, Confession, Absolution, and the Peace.

Nursery and PreK: Redeemer is blessed to have nursery care for infants through PreK. Nurseries are open every Sunday during the 9 and 11 AM Masses, as well as the 1PM Spanish Mass, and are specifically "well baby" spaces. Beepers are available to parents to keep contact with their little ones. All staff and volunteers who work with children and youth at Redeemer have been screened and have completed "Safeguarding God's Children" training.

Junior EYC Wednesdays 6-7:30 PM GH Senior EYC Sundays 6-7:30 PM GH

At Church of the Redeemer, we want our youth to be the heart of a true, life-giving, and Christ-centered group - a real community, hence Episcopal Youth Community (EYC). Core values in this youth ministry include worship, fellowship, and mission. We want all of our students to explore how these things fit as they continue to grow in Christ by means of experiencing life together in good times and during struggles. And, of course, that means having fun is important, too.

Our Youth Minister, Mr. Christoph Stephenson-Moe, says "We're looking forward to another awesome year, and we hope you'll Take Your Place with us as much as possible!"

Youth Confirmation Class: Wednesdays 5-6 PM

Logos: Redeemer's mid-week weekly event for children grades K-5 takes place Wednesday afternoons from



4-6:30. Playtime, proctored study hall, Bible study, art, choir and music, and "family-style" dinner make up our afternoons. To model the importance of living our faith every day of the week – not just Sundays – one parent of each Logos participant must make a time commitment to the program in some way.

Men of Redeemer's Business Men's Bible Study Wednesdays 7-8 AM

Intended to make a difference in the lives of local businessmen, this early meeting provides a spiritual, faith-based start to men's busy professional days and lives, still allowing them to get to the office on time. The meetings are centered around readings from the Daily Office, with the goal of encouraging daily Bible reading, reflection, and prayer. Join us for a mid-week spiritual lift and collegial support. Men's Friday Morning Prayer Breakfast is an opportunity for spiritual growth and fulfillment through prayer, study, and fellowship. All men of Redeemer, and of the community, are invited to gather at 7 AM in Gillespie Hall. Coffee and warm hospitality guaranteed!

Men's Saturday Morning Bible Study is an hour-long meeting in which the group offers intercessory prayer, discusses remarkable lives or events related to the calendar, and then reads and discusses either Scripture, or a book on faith or Christian living. Schedules permitting, they adjourn for breakfast.

The Rector's Class topics:

September: Life and Death in Scripture: Heaven, Hell & Purgatory. What does the Bible, and our tradition, tell us about these places? Do all dogs really go to heaven?

October: What does God insist you do? What one thing does God call on you to do that could only be described as your bounden duty? Join us as we explore the most important obligation God has asked of us.

December: The Birth Narratives in Matthew, Luke, and John. Incredible accounts of the infancy of the Only Begotten Son of God Jesus Christ our Lord and Savior. Discover how the origins of Jesus can change your life even today.
