Dear Redeemer Family,

Do you have a favorite Bible verse? When asked that question, many people are quick to say St. John 3:16 is their favorite verse. Most likely, you are already thinking about the words of this familiar verse—"For God so loved the world, that he gave his only begotten Son, that whosoever believeth in him should not perish, but have everlasting life."

In John 3:16, Jesus boils it all down, giving us the one and only thing required to bring change to our lives now and forever: belief. Interestingly, Jesus is never once on record as claiming anything else is needed. By believing, we open the door to new life, the forgiveness of our sins, and an eternal relationship with the Father through the Son in the power of the Holy Spirit. This is both the core and crowning proclamation of the Bible and the Apostolic Church, and this is what we refer to as the gospel—the good news!

Yet, almost every time I turn around, I discover an abiding temptation to add something to the gospel, making the good news about belief plus something else. Often I hear the gospel presented as belief plus effort—you know, calling for enough moral elbow grease to have a relationship with God and wind up in heaven. The trouble, however, is that nobody has ever entered heaven because of his or her goodness

or effort! Isn't it tragically ironic on a grand scale that the one thing required for relationship with God—belief—is the hardest thing for you and me to accept?!



Priest Associate for Christian Formation & Outreach

What did your ministry focus on in 2022?

Christian formation and outreach were the primary focus of my ministry in 2022. This included planning classes, scheduling priests for all masses, bringing in guest speakers, and serving on Redeemer's Mission & Outreach Committee. I also participated in the ministry all priests share: worship, preaching, teaching, outreach, visiting the sick, caring for the less fortunate, comforting the grieving, and most importantly, prayer.

What were your ministry's biggest successes in 2022?

We saw increased in-person attendance at formation classes held during the week and on Sundays. Another wonderful success was participating in the Mission & Outreach Committee of the Vestry, which awarded many grants and donated thousands of hours on behalf of Redeemer to charities locally and abroad.

What are your goals for 2023?

Priest Associate for Pastoral Care

The Reverend Ralph W. Strohm

What did your ministry focus on in 2022?

In 2022, we had a three-fold focus. First, which is ongoing, was getting to know our homebound or limited-mobility parishioners. There are new people to meet and changing health conditions for those already involved. Second, we focused on recruiting and scheduling Lay Eucharistic Visitors. Third, we worked to expand the meaning of "pastoral care" in the minds of our parishioners. Pastoral care is more than visiting the homebound. It includes the provision of spiritual advice and support, education, counseling, medical care, and assistance in times of need.

What were your ministry's biggest successes in 2022? We have been successful again in 2022 in recruiting several new Lay Eucharistic Visitors. These volunteers take the Blessed Sacrament to those who do not have the ability to attend one of our masses in person.

What are your goals for 2023?

We will continue to revise and develop resources available for Lay Eucharistic Visitors to use when they do home visits. We also plan to increase our identification of parishioners who may need pastoral care.

STAFF REPORTS

Organist-Choirmaster

Sam Nelson

What did your ministry focus on in 2022?

One of our goals for 2022 was to focus our resources on special music for masses and feast days rather than on extracurricular concerts. We also continued to rebuild our Royal School of Church Music program for students in first through twelfth grades, a process that will take several years to come to fruition. Plus, we made more of an effort to include living composers and diverse composers in our services and programming, which will continue to be a focus.

What were your ministry's biggest successes in 2022?

A large step toward offering additional special music on feast days was our All Souls' Day mass, which featured a requiem setting by Redeemer parishioner and choir member Cynthia Roberts-Greene. Our adult choir sang this requiem with accompaniment by a chamber orchestra.

We added over 50 new anthems to our monumental choral library in 2022. The choir offered 41 of these new anthems during Sunday masses and Evensong.

The choir stepped into doing more outreach activities, including Christmas caroling at a local senior living facility.

Five adults joined the choir, and additional members continue to come back and sing as they feel able and safe to do so.

What are your goals for 2023?

Our biggest goal for 2023 will be increasing the number of people in both our adult choir and Royal School of Church Music choirs to prepandemic numbers and beyond. We will also continue to beef up the special music on our principal feast days. Plans are in the works to offer additional special services, such as Tenebrae during Holy Week, a service that includes the use of 15 lighted candles that are individually extinguished as each psalm is completed.

Welcome Coordinator

Anne Ayres

What did your ministry focus on in 2022?

The Welcome Ministry at Redeemer was born in 2022! We focused immediately on making our visitors feel special and our new members feel welcome. We did this by establishing a Welcome Team Ministry, made up of parishioners who share this vision and have the gift of hospitality.

What were your ministry's biggest successes in 2022?

In 2022, 172 new members joined Redeemer!

Fr. Charleston Wilson reached out to visitors, and I followed up to answer questions and to see if they would like to join our parish family.

We established Welcome Receptions three times a year to welcome our newest members. These events took place at the rectory. Our new members enjoyed getting to know each other better and getting to know Redeemer's clergy and staff.

We created Redeemer 101, a class for new members. It is now offered three times a year. This class helps new members get to know each other and begin making friendships, learn about Redeemer's history in Sarasota, discover their spiritual gifts, and learn how they can get plugged in at Redeemer.

We started Coffee & Connect gatherings, a time for new members to attend a mid-week 10 a.m. mass at Redeemer followed by coffee and chatting with other new members, clergy, and staff.

Our Welcome Team Ministry grew to over 30 parishioners. These volunteers help with the Welcome Table on the front lawn on Sunday mornings, the red welcome cart on the veranda on Sunday mornings, and events throughout the year for new members. Look for the yellow name tags they wear that represent the light of Christ shining in and through them!

What are your goals for 2023?

We will refine the programs we put into place in 2022. We pray that many more people will join Redeemer to worship our living God!

STAFF REPORTS

Director of Children's Christian Formation

What did your ministry focus on in 2022? Our goal is always, with God's grace, to build deeper faith, solid foundations and community, and stronger families. We provide many ways to welcome children and families into parish life.

What were your ministry's biggest successes in 2022?

The excitement about our children's Christian formation programs is contagious! In addition to weekly Sunday School at the 9 a.m. and 1 p.m. Sunday masses, our entire nursery suite reopened in 2022 along with a new Mother's Lounge for nursing moms. Nursery Greeters now welcome families on Sunday mornings before the 9 a.m. mass. Our 1 p.m. Sunday School classes enjoy refreshed, dedicated classrooms. Our formation volunteers, including Sunday School teachers, Nursery Greeters, LOGOs volunteers, Just Do It volunteers, and Vacation Bible School volunteers enthusiastically participated in 2022 in our largest numbers ever.

In addition to all of our established special events, our Holy Week Tableaus, which involve all of our Sunday School classes, were presented for the first time as part of the Palm Sunday 9 a.m. mass. Splash Back to Sunday School and Movie on the Lawn were also hits! Summer Sunday Specials, our summer formation offering, resumed during July for kindergarten through twelfth graders. Vacation Bible School had record numbers of students, youth aides, and adult volunteers. LOGOS and Just Do It, our Wednesday evening programming for K-5th graders, welcomed many new families and volunteers.

What are your goals for 2023?

Our prayer is that many lives—children and their families—will be completely transformed by the grace of God in this parish church.

Youth Minister

Jackie Overton

What did your ministry focus on in 2022? Youth ministry at Redeemer took things back to the "CORE" with a focus on four areas:

Community — Creating safe and welcoming spaces for young people to explore their faith and support one another in their walk with Christ Outreach — Working together to bring the gospel into the world through our words and actions with local outreach and mission work Reflection — Spending time together weekly in study, prayer, and worship Evangelism — Reaching out to the community to invite others into a relationship with Jesus and the church

What were your ministry's biggest successes in 2022?

- We opened the Babcock Youth Center, a beautiful new space dedicated to youth. The Center has become a popular place for our young people who are eager to spend more time at church. They come in before programming to study and stay later for deeper discussions.
- We doubled the number of young people participating in youth ministry at Redeemer.
- Our young people stretched beyond their comfort zones on summer mission trips.
- Our young people continued to develop leadership skills, including dreaming up Redeemer's Serve on Saturday service projects and exploring ways to lead youth ministry events.

What are your goals for 2023?

- We will continue to reinvent and reenergize youth ministry programming with young people taking a central role in leadership.
- We will increase adult-to-youth mentorship through new programs and partnerships.
- We will prepare our young people for life after high school with events such as the College Chapel Crawl, a tour of Episcopal chapels at Florida universities.

Office Manager & Director of Event Services

What did your ministry focus on in 2022?

I supported ministries, activities, and parish-wide events and handled administrative and staffing functions for the church. My role is similar to a concierge, helping outside groups, Redeemer ministries, parishioners, and staff have the best experience possible during classes, events, and activities on campus.

What were your ministry's biggest successes in 2022?

Parishioners at Redeemer like to have fun! We came together for several wonderful events, such as a farewell brunch for our previous Associate Rector Fr. Chris Wood, Shrove Tuesday's Jazz and Jambalaya, Fourth of July fireworks, receptions after special services, and an evening to get to know the bishop candidates (to name a few).

What did your ministry focus on in 2022?

We released timely communication about parish news and events in a variety of formats, including announcements, eblasts, social media posts, newsletters, website updates, and more. We hired a part-time Communications & Digital Ministry Assistant, Lana Mullen, who has done a fantastic job.

What were your ministry's biggest successes in 2022?

We worked with Redeemer parishioners who generously shared their talents, including Michael Hales, who took stunning photographs of the campus that we use in print and online; Harriett Hritz, who designed a new logo for the Redeemer Gift & Book Shop; and Charlotte Staub Thomas, who drew the beautiful illustration for our 2022 Christmas card. We redesigned and developed new content for *In the Beginning*, our monthly newsletter that is mailed to parishioners. We collaborated with the Welcome Coordinator to share info about new members. We created new print pieces, including a visitor card, bookmarks, brochures, flyers, posters, and more.

What are your goals for 2023?
