Dear Redeemer Family,

For Christians around the world, Jesus' instruction to spread the good news of the gospel — to make new Christians — is known as the Great Commission. Redeemer is a Great Commission parish focused on making new Christians and making all Christians new.

The hand of Almighty God guided and blessed this parish church in wonderful ways in 2023. Your parish welcomed almost 180 new members, launched a number of new ministries, and contributed a record number of hours (and dollars) to outreach, which in turn alleviated human suffering and brought new life to those most in need in our community and in far-flung places around the world. We worshipped, sang together, cared for each other, and studied God's word. The gospel was preached and the Sacraments duly administered. Children and adult converts were baptized. Children and youth were nurtured in the knowledge and love of the Lord.

But far more important than what was done is *why* we set about doing it in the first place. Archbishop of Canterbury Thomas Cranmer rightly suggested, "What the heart loves, the will chooses."

The heart of this parish — what we love most — is the limitless love, mercy, and grace we have all received through the life, death, and resurrection of our Lord Jesus Christ. Everything we do — big and small — is just like the hymn puts it: in response to "love so amazing, so divine, demands my soul, my life, my all." As St. John said, "We love because He first loved us" (I John 4:19).

The happy hearts and generous hands of Redeemer's congregants show that we love gospel ministry and prove the words of St. Paul really are true; that "Christ's love compels us" (II Corinthians 5:14). This special event, part of Redeemer's annual series honoring Dr. King and observing Black History Month, will feature the Honorable Alexis Herman, the 23rd U.S. Secretary of Labor, and Judge Glenda Hatchett.

Herman was the first African American to lead the U.S. Department of Labor. In her public service and nonprofit work, she has served five U.S. presidents, both Democrats and Republicans.

Hatchett was appointed to a judgeship in 1990, becoming Georgia's first Black Chief Judge of a State Court. She has presided over the television shows *Judge Hatchett* and *The Verdict With Judge Hatchett*.

This event is free and open to the public.






Redeemer Awards Record Number of Scholastica Grants to Teachers

In January, Redeemer awarded 80 public school teachers in Sarasota and Manatee counties with a total of \$20,000 in grants for classroom enhancements. This is the third year Redeemer has provided St. Scholastica Grants, which are funded by parishioners, the church, and the Episcopal Thrift House. This year's grants represent an increase of over 30% in funds and recipients compared to 2023. Teachers who received the \$250 grants will be honored on Sunday, February 4, at the 9 a.m. mass.

Redeemer Distributes \$70,000 to Nonprofits in Sarasota and Beyond

At the end of 2023 and the beginning of 2024, Redeemer awarded grants totaling \$70,000 to the following organizations:

- \$20,000 for Help with Compassion, which plans to build a dormitory room for 35 high school girls in South Sudan
- \$15,000 to Isaiah 117 House, which provides a comforting place for children to wait for foster care placement
- \$15,000 for Second Heart Homes, which helps people who are homeless by providing housing and support
- \$7,500 for Redeemer's St. Scholastica Grants, which offers grants to public school teachers in Sarasota and Manatee counties
- \$5,000 for Sanctuary Hub, which supports the Church in Uganda
- \$5,000 for Women of Redeemer, which will be used to translate a book about freedom and faith by Katrina Wilson into Latvian
- \$2,500 for Beauty Bridge, which provides no-cost beauty services to women in need


